UPDATE

SUFFOLK, VA (December 7, 2016) Suffolk Police advise that the subject they are seeking who fled from police following yesterday afternoon's attempted residential break-in has been identified as Anthony Dwayne Valentine, age 19, with a last known address of the 1600 block of Cavalier Manor in Portsmouth.

Anyone with information related to Valentine's whereabouts is asked to contact Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. SUBJECTS FLEE FROM POLICE FOLLOWING ATTEMPTED RESIDENTIAL BREAK-IN

SUFFOLK, VA (December 6, 2016) Suffolk Police are currently conducting an ongoing investigation in the area of the 2400 block of Holland Road/Route 58 following an attempted residential break-in earlier this afternoon.

Emergency Communications was made aware of the incident at 3:08 p.m. after a witness contacted police to advise that four black males were seen attempting to break into a residence on Quince Road.

The subjects fled from the area in a Chevrolet Impala and were involved in a single vehicle accident in the 2100 block of Holland Road at 3:29 p.m. but proceeded to continue driving on Holland Road/Route 58. They then fled from the vehicle towards the wood line in the area of the 2400 block of Holland Road/Route 58. The Ace Hardware Redistribution Center made the decision to temporarily lock down their facility for approximately 45 minutes after witnesses observed the subjects in their area.

Three of the involved individuals were apprehended and are now in custody. Police are continuing to search the area for the fourth subject who was last seen in the area of the 3300 block of Holland Road wearing light colored shorts and no shirt. If anyone sees this individual, do not try to apprehend but contact Suffolk Police by calling 911.

The investigation remains ongoing at this time and no further information is available.
