ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (September 30, 2019) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Monday, September 30, 2019, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(Route 58) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures on Route 58 at OKelly Drive from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Suffolk Police will be providing traffic control.

(Pruden Boulevard) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures on Pruden Boulevard at Meade Parkway from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m. Suffolk Police will be providing traffic control.

(Elwood Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation in the 6800 block of Elwood Road from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

(Portsmouth Boulevard) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Portsmouth Boulevard between Wilroy Road and Route 58 for vegetation maintenance from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(West Constance Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works Traffic Engineering Paint Crew will have a mobile operation on West Constance Road between 2nd Avenue and West Washington Street from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

(Old Myrtle Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a mobile operation in the 5400 block of Old Myrtle Road for drainage maintenance from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

(Indian Trail) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a mobile operation in the 3300 block of Indian Trail for drainage maintenance from 12 p.m. to 3 p.m.

(North Main Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a right turn closure on North Main Street at Market Street for sidewalk repairs from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Lincoln Avenue) – A contractor working for the Suffolk Department of Public Utilities will have a flagging operation in the 900 block of Lincoln Avenue from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., September 30 through October 4.

(Foxcroft Road) – A contractor will have a crew working in the 100 block of Foxcroft Road from 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Washington Street) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Washington Street between Wilroy Road and the railroad trestle for litter control and vegetation maintenance from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

(Route 58) – A contractor will have mobile operations eastbound on Route 58 between Route 272 and Downtown Holland for litter control and vegetation maintenance from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(Route 189) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Route 189 for litter control and vegetation maintenance from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.

(Route 272) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Route 272 for litter control and vegetation maintenance from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

(Whaleyville area) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations throughout the Whaleyville area for drainage maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Holy Neck Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a mobile operation on Holy Neck Road between Greenwood Road and Pineview Road for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

(West Washington Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will be working in the 500 block of West Washington Street for sidewalk repairs from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Freeney Avenue) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will be working on Freeney Avenue at Camp Avenue from 12 p.m. to 3 p.m.

(North Capital Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have the 100 block of North Capital Street closed with a detour from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(various locations) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations on Manning Road, Cypress Chapel Road, Greenway Road, Camp Pond Road, Corinth Chapel Road and Bennetts Pasture Road for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Upcoming Projects:

(Holland Road) – A contractor will have an eastbound right lane closure in the 2400 to 2500 block of Holland Road for overhead power line replacement from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., October 1 through October 5.

(Suburban Drive) – Beginning Tuesday, October 1, CSX Railroad and the Suffolk Department of Public Works Operations Division will have Suburban Drive between East Washington Street and Portsmouth Boulevard closed with a detour for railroad crossing repairs and upgrades to the approaches. Work will take place between 8 a.m. to and 5 p.m. and is expected to be complete by 5 p.m., Friday, October 4.

(Kings Fork Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Kings Fork Road closed with a detour between Lake Meade Drive and Joshua Lane for bridge maintenance beginning at 7 a.m., Tuesday, October 1. The roadway is expected to open at 5 p.m., Friday, October 5.

Ongoing Projects:

(Bridge Road) – Beginning Sunday, September 15, 2019, a contractor will have alternating lane closures on Bridge Road between the Chesapeake City line and Harbour View Boulevard overnight from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. for milling and paving for approximately 3 weeks.

(Old Mill Road) – Beginning, Monday, September 23, 2019, Old Mill Road will be closed between Old Myrtle Road and Indian Trail. The current bridge will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately May 2020. Variable message boards announcing the closure are in place as of September 16.

(Pughsville Road) – A contractor will have a section of Pughsville Road closed with a detour in place between Townpoint Road and Shoulders Hill Road beginning on Saturday, September 14, 2019. The road is expected to be closed to through traffic for approximately 6 to 8 weeks. During this time, accommodations will be made for residents, emergency vehicles, and school buses only.

(Mineral Spring Road) – Beginning, Thursday, June 27, Mineral Spring Road will be closed between Holland Corner Road and Arthur Drive. The current bridge over Jones Swamp will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The work will also include elevating a section of Mineral Spring Road. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately November 2019.
