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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (October 4, 2019) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Friday, October 4, 2019, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(Lincoln Avenue) – A contractor working for the Suffolk Department of Public Utilities will have a flagging operation in the 900 block of Lincoln Avenue from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., September 30 through October 4.

(Carolina Road) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Carolina Road between the 600 block and Whaleyville Boulevard for litter control and vegetation maintenance from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m.

(Wilroy Road) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures on Wilroy Road at Olde Mill Creek Drive from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Suffolk Police will be providing traffic control.

(Pruden Boulevard and Meade Parkway) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures on Pruden Boulevard and Meade Parkway from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Suffolk Police will be providing traffic control.

(Route 58) – A contractor will have an eastbound mobile operation on Route 58 between South Quay Road and Route 460 for litter control and vegetation maintenance from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(Carolina Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works Traffic Engineering Paint Crew will have mobile lane closures on southbound Carolina Road between Turlington Road and Airport Road from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

(Route 58) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations eastbound and westbound on Route 58 between the Route 13/32 Bypass and the Chesapeake City line for debris removal from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Portsmouth Boulevard) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations eastbound and westbound on Portsmouth Boulevard between Suburban Drive and Route 58 for debris removal from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Manning Bridge Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging mobile operation in the 400 block of Manning Bridge Road for drainage maintenance from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

(Pineview Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a mobile operation in the 8300 block of Pineview Road for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(North Capital Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have the 100 block of North Capital Street closed with a detour from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Hillpoint Boulevard) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a right turn lane closure on Hillpoint Boulevard at Hillpoint Boulevard North from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(various locations) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations on Greenway Road, Cherry Grove Road, Lonely Lane, Simons Drive and Old Myrtle Road for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Holy Neck Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a mobile operation in the 6000 block of Holy Neck Road for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Holland Road) – A contractor will have an eastbound right lane closure in the 2400 to 2500 block of Holland Road for overhead power line replacement from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., October 1 through October 5.

(Suburban Drive) – Beginning Tuesday, October 1, CSX Railroad and the Suffolk Department of Public Works Operations Division will have Suburban Drive between East Washington Street and Portsmouth Boulevard closed with a detour for railroad crossing repairs and upgrades to the approaches. Work will take place between 8 a.m. to and 5 p.m. and is expected to be complete by 5 p.m., Friday, October 4.

Upcoming Projects:

(Suburban Drive) – Beginning, Monday, October 7, Suffolk Department of Public Works Operations will have Suburban Drive closed with a detour between East Washington Street and Portsmouth Boulevard. Work will take place between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. and is expected to be complete by 5 p.m., Thursday, October 10.

(North Main Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities will have a southbound turn lane closure in the 1400 block of North Main Street from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday, October 7.

(North Main Street) – A contractor will have a northbound mobile operation in the 1000 to 1900 blocks of North Main Street overnight from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., October 6.

(Progress Road) – A contractor will have a mobile shoulder closure in the 1100 block of Progress Road from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., October 7.

Ongoing Projects:

(Bridge Road) – Beginning Sunday, September 15, 2019, a contractor will have alternating lane closures on Bridge Road between the Chesapeake City line and Harbour View Boulevard overnight from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. for milling and paving through the weekend for paving. The paving operation is expected to be complete, Wednesday, October 9.

(Kings Fork Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Kings Fork Road closed with a detour between Lake Meade Drive and Joshua Lane for bridge maintenance beginning at 7 a.m., Tuesday, October 1 and is expected to open at 5 p.m., Wednesday, October 9.

(Old Mill Road) – Beginning, Monday, September 23, 2019, Old Mill Road will be closed between Old Myrtle Road and Indian Trail. The current bridge will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately May 2020. Variable message boards announcing the closure are in place as of September 16.

(Pughsville Road) – A contractor will have a section of Pughsville Road closed with a detour in place between Townpoint Road and Shoulders Hill Road beginning on Saturday, September 14, 2019. The road is expected to be closed to through traffic for approximately 6 to 8 weeks. During this time, accommodations will be made for residents, emergency vehicles, and school buses only.

(Mineral Spring Road) – Beginning, Thursday, June 27, Mineral Spring Road will be closed between Holland Corner Road and Arthur Drive. The current bridge over Jones Swamp will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The work will also include elevating a section of Mineral Spring Road. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately November 2019.

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
