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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (November 26, 2019) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Tuesday, November 26, 2019, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(North Capital Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have the 200 block of North Capital Street closed with a detour for drainage maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Dill Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Dill Road between Charlotte Avenue and Hunter Street closed with a detour from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Hollywood Neighborhood) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will be performing drainage maintenance in the Hollywood neighborhood from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Carolina Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities line maintenance crew will have a lane closure in the 700 block of Carolina Road from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Everets Road) – A contractor will have a lane closure in the 6600 - 6700 block of Everets Road from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday and until 12 p.m. on Wednesday.

(Northgate Commerce Parkway) – A contractor will have a crew working in the 2600 block of Northgate Commerce Parkway from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday and until 12 p.m. on Wednesday. No traffic control needed.

(Kenyon Road and Forest Glen Drive) – A contractor will be working on Kenyon Road and Forest Glen Drive off the shoulder from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. No traffic control required.

(Route 58/Wilroy Road Exit) – A contractor will have a westbound shoulder closure on Route 58 at the Wilroy Road exit from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. They will also have a right shoulder closure on westbound Route 58 at the Route 58 Business interchange from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Upcoming Projects:

(Route 10/Godwin Boulevard) – A contractor will have multiple eastbound and westbound lane shifts on Route 10 nightly from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. to perform a water tie in. The westbound lane shifts will be between Main Street and the Route 58 interchange and the eastbound lane shifts between Centerbrooke Lane and William Reid Drive. Work will start Sunday, December 1 and is expected to be complete at 5 a.m. Saturday, December 7.

Ongoing Projects:

(Route 58) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures eastbound on Route 58 between the Southampton County line and Holy Neck Road from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., November 12 through November 26. Work will be daily including weekends.

(Respass Beach Road) – A contractor will have a southbound lane closure on Respass Beach Road between Hampton Roads Parkway and the 6700 block for curb work from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., November 25 through November 26.

(Turlington Road and Jackson Road) – A contractor will have shoulder closures at the intersection on both Turlington Road and Jackson Road from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., November 12 through November 26.

(Pruden Boulevard/Route 460) –A contractor will have a permanent westbound lane closure in the 5000 block of Pruden Boulevard/Route 460 at Old Myrtle Road. Traffic will be restricted to one lane in each direction with the middle lane as a turn lane to Old Myrtle Road and the construction site. The new traffic pattern will be in place for approximately 4 to 6 weeks. Message boards have been placed to notify motorists of the change in traffic pattern. Additionally, the speed limit within the work zone area will be lowered to 45 miles per hour until the end of the project. Any future changes in traffic patterns will be updated as needed.

(Old Mill Road) – Beginning, Monday, September 23, 2019, Old Mill Road will be closed between Old Myrtle Road and Indian Trail. The current bridge will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately May 2020. Variable message boards announcing the closure are in place as of September 16.

(Mineral Spring Road) – Beginning, Thursday, June 27, Mineral Spring Road will be closed between Holland Corner Road and Arthur Drive. The current bridge over Jones Swamp will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The work will also include elevating a section of Mineral Spring Road. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately December 2019.

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
