### **ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS**

SUFFOLK, VA (March 11, 2020) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Wednesday, March 11, 2020, due to construction and maintenance projects.

**New Projects:**

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Nansemond Parkway between the 2600 block and Bennetts Pasture Road overnight from 9 p.m. to 4 a.m., March 10 and March 11.

(William Reid Drive) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures on William Reid Drive overnight from 4:30 p.m. to 5 a.m., Wednesday, March 11 and Thursday, March 12.

(Portsmouth Boulevard) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Portsmouth Boulevard between Wilroy Road and the Route 58 on-ramp for vegetation maintenance and debris pickup from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Nansemond Parkway between Cherry Blossom Drive and Regency Drive for a storm water pipe installation from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., March 11 through March 25.

(Nansemond Parkway) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a mobile operation on Nansemond Parkway from the 3700 block to Bennetts Pasture Road for asphalt maintenance from 12 p.m. to 3 p.m.

(Maple Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities will have the 100 block of Maple Street closed with a detour for a sewer line repair from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Adams Swamp Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Adams Swamp Road for asphalt repair from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(North Main Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile right lane closures in both directions on North Main Street at the bridge over Hall Street for vegetation maintenance from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Route 58) – A contractor will have the left shoulder of the westbound Route 58 on ramp at Godwin Boulevard closed for guardrail repairs from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

(Route 58) – A contractor will have the westbound Route 58 left turn closed at the SPSA crossover for guardrail repairs from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. They will also have a left turn lane closure at the crossover near the scales for guardrail repairs from 1:30 p.m. to 3 p.m.

### **Upcoming Projects:**

(Godwin Boulevard and William Reid Drive) – A contractor will have an eastbound lane closure on Godwin Boulevard at William Reid Drive and alternating lane closures on William Reid Drive overnight from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., March 14 and March 15.

### **Ongoing Projects:**

(Nansemond Parkway) – Beginning March 4, a contractor will have a permanent outside eastbound lane closure in the 5400 block of Nansemond Parkway for curb and entrance improvements. Work is expected to be complete by March 18, weather permitting.

(Holland Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities will have a westbound shoulder closure on Holland Road between Lummis Road and the 3200 block of Holland Road from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., March 2 through March 14.

(Kenyon Court) – A contractor will have a crew working behind the shoulder on Kenyon Court from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., February 24 through March 13.

(Old Mill Road) – Beginning Monday, September 23, 2019, Old Mill Road will be closed between Old Myrtle Road and Indian Trail. The current bridge will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately May 2020. Variable message boards announcing the closure are in place as of September 16.

(Holland Road) – A contractor will be working off the shoulder on Holland Road between Kenyon Road and Manning Road from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., March 10 through March 13.

(South 6<sup>th</sup> Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on South 6<sup>th</sup> Street between East Washington Street and the bridge from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., March 9 through March 13.
