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### **ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS**

SUFFOLK, VA (April 21, 2020) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Tuesday, April 21, 2020, due to construction and maintenance projects.

#### **New Projects:**

(Sleepy Hole Road) – A contractor will have Sleepy Hole Road closed with a detour between River Breeze Road and Kings Highway to install utility connections beginning April 20. This closure is anticipated to last approximately 2 weeks, weather permitting.

(Kings Highway) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Kings Highway between Crittenden Road and Bob House Parkway overnight from 4 p.m. to 5 a.m.

(Kenyon Road) – A contractor will have a left turn lane closure on Kenyon Road at Holland from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(West Washington Street) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on West Washington Street between Pine Street and Clay Street from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Nansemond Parkway between Kings Highway and the Chesapeake City line for vegetation maintenance and litter control from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Portsmouth Boulevard) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Portsmouth Boulevard between Nansemond Parkway and the Route 58 on-ramp for vegetation maintenance and litter control from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Quince Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Quince Road between Lummis Road and Pioneer Road for drainage maintenance from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m.

(various locations) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations on Manning Road, Badger Road, Deer Path Road, Milford Lane, Indian Trail and the Harbour View area for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Beamon Mills Subdivision) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will be working in the Beamon Mills Subdivision on drainage maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Bank Street Extended) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Bank Street Extended closed with a detour between North Lloyd Street and North Capital Street from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

(Holland Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works Traffic Signals crew will have a westbound mobile operation on Holland Road between Lakewood Drive and Cove Point Drive from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and between Beechwood Drive and Manning Bridge Road from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

**Upcoming Projects:**

(Bridge Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation in the 1400 block of Bridge Road, at the bridge, overnight from 7 p.m. to 4 a.m., April 23.

(West Washington Street and North Saratoga Street) – A contractor will have lane closures on West Washington Street and North Saratoga Street from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 24. Suffolk Police will be assisting with traffic control at the signalized intersection.

(Pughsville Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works Traffic Engineering Paint Crew will have a flagging operation on Pughsville Road at Shoulders Hill Road from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m., April 22.

**Ongoing Projects:**

(Route 58) – A contractor will have crews working beyond the shoulder on Route 58 between Manning Road and the Route 13/32 Bypass from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., April 16 through April 24. Work will take place Tuesday through Friday.

(Pughsville Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Pughsville Road between Shoulders Hill Road and Bellflower Lane from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., March 20 through June 12.

(Godwin Boulevard) – A contractor will have a flagging operation in the 6000 to 6200 blocks of Godwin Boulevard from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., March 16 through May 1.

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Nansemond Parkway between Cherry Blossom Drive and Regency Drive for a storm water pipe installation from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., March 11 through April 23.

(Old Mill Road) – Beginning Monday, September 23, 2019, Old Mill Road will be closed between Old Myrtle Road and Indian Trail. The current bridge will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure. The road is expected to be closed with a detour until approximately May 2020. Variable message boards announcing the closure are in place as of September 16.

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
