UPDATE

SUFFOLK, VA (June 12, 2020) Suffolk Police advise that Preston Otis Davis, IV, was arrested on Wednesday, June 10, 2020, on charges including Aggravated Malicious Wounding (2 counts), Reckless Handling of Firearm, Use/Display Firearm in Commission of Felony, and Possess/Transport Firearm by Convicted Felon.

He is currently in custody at the Western Tidewater Regional Jail.

The Suffolk Police Department would like to thank the media and the public for their assistance.

The investigation remains ongoing at this time.

POLICE INVESTIGATING SHOOTING INCIDENT

SUFFOLK, VA (June 5, 2020) Suffolk Police are currently investigating a shooting incident that occurred early Thursday morning, June 4, 2020.

Emergency Communications received a call at 2:57 a.m. advising of shots fired in the 1000 block of Nansemond Parkway. Officers responded to the scene and found

several vehicles that had been damaged by gunfire. Officers came into contact with an adult male victim that had sustained a non-life threatening gunshot wound and was transported to a local hospital by an acquaintance. The victim is identified as Antonio Delamonte Roseboro, age 33, of Suffolk. Two apartment buildings at the Heritage Acres complex were also damaged by gunfire.

Suffolk Police are actively searching for a suspect, Preston Otis Davis, IV, age 27, of Suffolk, who is currently wanted on several outstanding warrants to include Reckless Handling of Firearm, Use or Display Firearm in Commission of Felony, Firearm: Possess by Felon, and Attempt to Commit Non-Capital Offense (two counts). Davis is a black male who has brown hair and brown eyes. He stands approximately 5'11" tall and weighs 180 pounds. Mug shot attached.

The investigation remains ongoing at this time.
