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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (October 2, 2020) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Friday, October 2, 2020, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(Route 58) – A contractor will have eastbound left shoulder closure on Route 58 at the scales crossover for guardrail repairs from 1 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

(Route 58) – A contractor will have crews maintaining vegetation on the Route 58 eastbound slopes at Godwin Boulevard from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

(East Constance Road) – A contractor will have a left lane closure on East Constance Road at Proctor Street from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

(Sleepy Hole Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Sleepy Hole Road between River Breeze Road and Nansemond Pointe Drive from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Route 13/32 Bypass) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on the Route 13/32 Bypass for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(White Marsh Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on White Marsh Road between East Washington Street and Locust Street for paving from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Audubon Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Audubon Road for shoulder maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Godwin Boulevard) – A contractor will have a flagging operation in the 6300 block of Godwin Boulevard from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have mobile operation on Nansemond Parkway starting at Portsmouth Boulevard and Kings Highway for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(various locations) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations Greenway Road, Cypress Chapel Road, Lake Prince Drive, Kings Fork Road, and Archers Mill for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Monitor Merrimac Memorial Bridge Tunnel/I-664) – A contractor will have the southbound lanes at the Monitor Merrimac Memorial Bridge Tunnel/I-664 closed with a detour for a paving operation beginning Friday, October 2 at 9 p.m. The southbound lanes will remain closed until 5 a.m. Monday, October 5, 2020. Beginning Friday, October 9, the northbound lanes will be closed with a detour until Monday, October 12 at 5 a.m. During these scheduled closures, an increase in traffic is expected along the detour routes including Bridge Road.

Upcoming Projects:

(Church Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities Line Maintenance will have the 100 block of Church Street closed with a detour from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., October 5.

(Harbour View Boulevard) – A contractor will have a southbound outside lane closure on Harbour View Boulevard between Harbour Pointe Drive and River Club Drive from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., October 5.

(various locations) – Suffolk Department of Public Works crews will have mobile sweeping operations to clear debris on Route 58, and Portsmouth Boulevard on Saturday, October 3.

Ongoing Projects:

(Manning Bridge Road) – A contractor will be working on the shoulder in the 300 block of Manning Bridge Road from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., September 21 through October 2.

(Railroad Avenue) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Railroad Avenue between North Capital Street and North 5th Street closed with a detour for drainage upgrades from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., September 30 through October 2.

(North 4th Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have the 200 block of North 4th Street closed for drainage upgrades from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., September 30 through October 2.

(Constance Road/ Western Avenue) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures eastbound and westbound on Constance Road between Church Street and Broad Street for milling and paving from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., September 24 and October 2. The Operation will also require Western Avenue to be closed with a detour.

(Hunter Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have the 300 block of Hunter Street closed with a detour for drainage upgrades from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., September 21 through October 2.

(Wilroy Road) – A contractor will have Wilroy Road closed in both directions between River Creek Drive and Lassiter Lane beginning Monday, July 20, 2020. The closure is necessary to demolish the existing deficient culvert and build a new bridge on Wilroy Road. This will provide a safe and long-term solution to the current culvert and shoulder. The road will be closed with a detour in place until mid-late November 2020.

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
