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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (October 8, 2020) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Thursday, October 8, 2020, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(Whaleyville Boulevard) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation in the 4000 block of Whaleyville Boulevard for drainage maintenance from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Route 58) – A contractor will have a westbound returning eastbound mobile operation on Route 58 between the Godwin Boulevard and the Route 13/32 Bypass for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(various locations) – A contractor will have crews working on Pruden Boulevard at the Route 58 interchange, Pitchkettle Road at Route 58 off-ramp westbound, and in the 1200 block of Portsmouth Boulevard from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

(Bridge Road) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Bridge Road between Eclipse Drive and Townpoint Road from 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Pruden Boulevard) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Pruden Boulevard between North Main Street and the Isle of Wight county line for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(Bridge Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a northbound mobile right lane closure in the 2800 block of Bridge Road for slope mowing from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

(Bridge Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a northbound mobile right lane closure on Bridge Road between Lee Farm Lane and Bennetts Creek Lane for slope mowing from 12 p.m. to 3 p.m.

(Railroad Avenue) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Railroad Avenue closed with a detour between North 5th Street and North Capital Street from 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(North Main Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities will have a right lane closure in the 700 block of North Main Street from 9 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

(Carolina Road) – A contractor will have a left lane closure in the 300 block of Carolina Road from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Audubon Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Audubon Road for shoulder maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(various locations) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations on Cypress Chapel Road, Mineral Spring Road, Holland Road, and Route 189 for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Upcoming Projects:

(Monitor Merrimac Memorial Bridge Tunnel/I-664) – Beginning Friday, October 9, the northbound lanes at the Monitor Merrimac Memorial Bridge Tunnel/I-664 will be closed with a detour until Monday, October 12 at 5 a.m. for a paving operation. During these scheduled closures, an increase in traffic is expected along the detour routes including Bridge Road.

(East Washington Street) – A contractor will have a right lane closure in the 800 block of East Washington Street from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., October 12.

(York Street) – A contractor will have a right lane closure in the 300 block of York Street from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., October 12.

Ongoing Projects:

(various locations) – A contractor will be performing pavement condition ratings throughout the City of Suffolk for the next 20 to 30 days between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., October 5 through November 5.

(White Marsh Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on White Marsh Road between East Washington Street and Locust Street for paving from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., October 5 through October 9.

(various locations) – A contractor will have mobile operations on Matoaka Road, Cherokee Drive, and Lake Prince Drive for vegetation maintenance from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., October 5 through October 9.

(Hunter Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have the 300 block of Hunter Street closed with a detour for drainage upgrades from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., October 5 through October 9.

(North 4th Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have the 200 block of North 4th Street closed with a detour for drainage upgrades from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., October 5 through October 9.

(Wilroy Road) – A contractor will have Wilroy Road closed in both directions between River Creek Drive and Lassiter Lane beginning Monday, July 20, 2020. The closure is necessary to demolish the existing deficient culvert and build a new bridge on Wilroy Road. This will provide a safe and long-term solution to the current culvert and shoulder. The road will be closed with a detour in place until mid-late November 2020.

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
