POLICE INVESTIGATING A SHOOTING INTO AN OCCUPIED DWELLING WHICH RESULTED IN A 10 MONTH OLD CHILD BEING INJURED

SUFFOLK, VA (October 13, 2021) On October 12, 2021, at approximately 11:40 PM the Suffolk 911 Center received a call for shots fired in the area of Spruce Street and Raleigh Avenue. When units arrived to canvass the area several shell casings were discovered near the intersection of Laurel Street and Columbus Avenue. Officers also discovered two residences were damaged in the 200 block of Columbus Avenue and a 10-month old child had sustained a gunshot wound. The child was treated by Suffolk Fire and Rescue and transported to a local hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

The investigation remains ongoing at this time, and there is no further information available for release.
