## UPDATE

SUFFOLK, Virginia (August 13, 2014) The Suffolk Fire Marshal's Office advises that following their investigation this afternoon Suffolk Police arrested Dion Devonte Jones, age 18, of Suffolk, on charges of Arson/Personal Property Greater than \$200, Arson of an Unoccupied Building Greater than \$200, and Bomb/Burn Threat. He is currently being held at Western Tidewater Regional Jail.

SUFFOLK, Virginia (August 5, 2014) The Suffolk Fire Marshal's Office advises that following their preliminary investigation the fire which destroyed a vehicle and damaged a new mobile home early Saturday morning is believed to be suspicious.

### **FIRE DAMAGES MOBILE HOME AND DESTROYS CAR**

SUFFOLK, Virginia (August 2, 2014) Suffolk Fire & Rescue and the Suffolk Police Department were on the scene earlier this morning of a residential structure fire.

Emergency Communications received the call at 5:38 a.m. and units were on scene at 5:46 a.m. The initial call was a vehicle fire close to a mobile home located in Bullock's Mobile Home Park in the 3800 block of Pughsville Road. Upon arrival, the vehicle was fully involved by fire and had extended to the mobile home. The fire was extinguished and under control within 12 minutes. The vehicle was declared a total loss. The mobile home was new and not yet occupied.

Engines 5, 25, Ladder 5, Medic 5, Battalion 2 and the Fire Marshal responded to the fire. No firefighters were injured.

The cause of the fire is under investigation by the Fire Marshal's Office.
