**SUFFOLK POLICE SEEK PUBLIC'S ASSISTANCE WITH CREDIT CARD  
FRAUD INVESTIGATION**

SUFFOLK, Virginia (August 5, 2014) The Suffolk Police Department is seeking the public's assistance in identifying a suspect in a credit card fraud incident.

On July 10, 2014, Suffolk Police received a report from a victim that their vehicle had been broken into in the Northern Suffolk area. The victim reported their credit card was one of several items taken. The credit card was later used by an unknown suspect on July 11, 2014, at a Wendy's Restaurant in the 1000 block of Independence Boulevard in Virginia Beach. Video surveillance from the restaurant captured images of a subject using the credit card for a transaction.

Anyone with information is asked to contact Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. Citizens can also utilize TipSoft to anonymously submit crime-related tips through the Web, a text message, or from any Android or iPhone mobile device with the [TipSubmit mobile app](#).
