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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (April 4, 2013) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Thursday, April 4, 2013, due to construction and maintenance projects:

New Projects:

(Shoulders Hill Road and Nansemond Parkway intersection) - A contractor continues with ongoing work at the intersection of Shoulders Hill Road and Nansemond Parkway. The contractor will have a lane closure with flagging operations in place from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. The operation will take place in the northbound lane of Shoulders Hill Road from Count Crescent extending 500 feet toward the train tracks. Both northbound and southbound lanes of travel will be affected.

(Route 10/Godwin Boulevard) – A contractor will have a shoulder closure on Route 10/Godwin Boulevard between the Reids Ferry Bridge and Harrell Drive from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway & Kings Highway) – A contractor will be maintaining vegetation along Nansemond Parkway and Kings Highway.

(Route 17/Bridge Road) – A contractor will be maintaining vegetation along Route 17/Bridge Road.

(Progress Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a mobile flagging operation on Progress Road between Wilroy Road and Nansemond Parkway from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Ongoing Projects:

(Market Street & Henley Place) – Thru traffic on Market Street and Henley Place will be restricted beginning Tuesday, March 26 through Friday, April 26 due to utilities installation for the new E-911/Municipal Center project. The west entrance to the Main Municipal Center Parking Lot will be closed. All public and staff traffic to the Human Resources Building will utilize the same entrance and travel along the north side of the parking lot to the building. Access to the Human Resources Building can also happen via Washington Street to Pender Street on the west side of the Police Administration Building.

(Dutch Road) – A Suffolk Department of Public Utilities contractor will be installing water lines under the railroad tracks as part of the on-going water improvement with the Village of Holland. Dutch Road from Holland Road to Cumberland Lane will be closed from April 4 through April 12 (weather permitting). Traffic to and from Dutch Road will be re-routed around the work area utilizing Holland Road, South Quay Road, and Cumberland Lane. Access to businesses on Dutch Road at Holland Road will be available.

(Village of Holland) – A contractor will have periodic flagging operations in place on Ruritan Boulevard, South Quay Road, and Holland Road Business and side streets within the Holland Village area, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., installing new water mains. The expected completion date is September 2013.

(Pruden Boulevard) – A contractor will have the right eastbound lane on Pruden Boulevard closed from the 2500 block of Pruden Boulevard to Meade Parkway until 3 p.m. This closure will be in effect periodically until October 2013 while a new pump station is constructed.

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
