ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (August 31, 2016) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Wednesday, August 31, 2016, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(North Main Street) – A contractor will have a lane closure on the northbound outside lane on North Main Street between the 1700 and 1900 blocks from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m., August 29th through September 2nd.

(Bridge Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a southbound lane closure in the 3300 block of Bridge Road for bridge maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway) – Suffolk Department of Public Works Traffic Engineering will have alternating shoulder closures on eastbound and westbound Nansemond Parkway between the High School and Elementary School from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

(Charlotte Avenue) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Charlotte Avenue closed at Dill Road and Lewis Avenue from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Nansemond Parkway between Helen Street and the Chesapeake City line for a communication line installation. This operation will have short duration lane stoppages throughout the day between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

(Harbour View Boulevard) – A contractor will have a northbound right lane closure in the 6800 block of Harbour View Boulevard from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., August 31st and September 1st.

(Carolina Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Carolina Road between Cypress Chapel Road and Babbtown Road for asphalt repair from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Route 58 Business) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on eastbound and westbound Route 58 Business (Holland Road and Portsmouth Boulevard) for vegetation maintenance from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

(Holland Road) – A contractor will have a westbound lane closure in the 6000 block of Holland Road for ditch maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Pruden Boulevard) – A contractor will have a shoulder closure in the 2600 block of Pruden Boulevard from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(South Quay Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation eastbound in the 7100 block of South Quay Road for ditch maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Townpoint Road) – A contractor will have a lane closure on Townpoint Road at Anderson Road for repair work.

(Pinner Street) – A contractor will have a westbound lane closure on Pinner Street between Moore Avenue and Katherine Street for a milling and paving operation from 7:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., August 31st and September 1st.

(East Constance Road) – A contractor will have an eastbound lane closure on East Constance Road at Katherine Street for a milling and paving operation on August 31st and September 1st from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Upcoming Projects:

(West Constance Road) – A contractor will have West Constance Road between 2nd Avenue and Pitchkettle Road closed for railroad crossing maintenance for 24 hours beginning at 7 a.m., September 1st. A detour will be in place.

(Prentis Street) – A contractor will have Prentis Street closed between North Main Street and Pine Street for a milling and paving operation from 7:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. with a detour in place, September 2nd.

(Katherine Street) – A contractor will be paving Katherine Street between East Constance and East Pinner Street on September 1st.

Ongoing Projects:

(Arthur Drive) – A contractor will be reconstructing bridges over Spivey Run and Langston Swamp on Arthur Drive. A detour will be in place to direct motorists with the detour in place. This closure is expected to be complete by December 30, 2016.

(Katherine Street) – A contractor will have Katherine Street closed to thru traffic between East Pinner Street and East Constance Road from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. All traffic will be detoured to surrounding streets. Accommodations will be made for residents and emergency vehicles. Work in this area is expected to continue through September 23rd.

(Seaboard Trail) – A contractor will have the Seaboard Trail from Main Street to Moore Avenue closed to all pedestrians until further notice. The contractor is estimating a mid-September completion.

(Highland Avenue) – A contractor will be installing a new pump station and sewer and water lines on Highland Avenue between Kingsboro Street and the end of Highland Avenue at the cul-de-sac. This project will continue through June 2017.
