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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (September 25, 2012) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Tuesday, September 25, 2012, due to construction and maintenance projects:

New Projects:

(Route 58/Holland Road) – A contractor will have intermittent lane closures on eastbound Route 58/Holland Road between Manning Bridge Road and Robin Lane for a couple of hours every weekday from September 17 through September 28.

(Archers Mill Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Archers Mill Road between Joshua Lane and Old Myrtle Road until 3 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Nansemond Parkway between Kings Highway and Suffolk Meadows Boulevard from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. This work is scheduled to continue through September 28.

(Turlington Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation on Turlington Road from Jackson Road to Kilby Shores Drive until 3 p.m.

(Ruritan Boulevard) – A contractor will have a flagging operation in place on Ruritan Boulevard, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Turlington Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities Line Maintenance will have a lane closure at the 600 block of Turlington Road to complete utility work. Traffic control will be set up from 9:30 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Ongoing Projects:

(Route 10) - Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagger operation on Route 10 between Everets Road and Kings Highway until 3 p.m. This work zone is an ongoing project set for completion by December of 2012.

(Shoulders Hill Road and Nansemond Parkway intersection) - A contractor will continue with ongoing work at the intersection of Shoulder's Hill Road and Nansemond Parkway.

(Mills Godwin Bridge, Route 17/Bridge Road) - A contractor will be removing and replacing the concrete bridge deck overlay material at the Mills Godwin Bridge, Route 17/Bridge Road. The work zone will be in effect from 7 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday. The work project is expected to last 90 days, weather permitting, with flagging operations in place during work hours. Intermittent day work will be performed Thursday, September 20 between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

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
