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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (October 22, 2018) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Monday, October 22, 2018, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(Route 58) – Beginning, Sunday, October 21, a contractor will have alternating lane closures eastbound on Route 58 between the Wilroy Road Interchange and Portsmouth Boulevard for milling and paving overnight from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.

(Craig Drive) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Craig Drive from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The milling and paving operation will include Saturday work and is expected to be complete Tuesday, October 23, weather permitting.

(Pitchkettle Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation on Pitchkettle Road between West Constance Road and Lincoln Avenue overnight from 7 p.m. to 1 a.m.

(Highland Avenue and Nansemond Avenue) – A contractor will have crews working on Highland Avenue and Nansemond Avenue from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(North Lloyd Street) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation in the 100 block of North Lloyd Street from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Bank Street Extended) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Bank Street Extended closed between North Capital Street and North Lloyd Street from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Crittenden Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Utilities will have a lane closure on Crittenden Road between Macedonia Avenue and Sawmill Point Road from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Manning Bridge Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation in the 200 block of Manning Bridge Road for drainage maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Murphys Mill Road, Girl Scout Road, and Lake Prince Drive) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations on Murphys Mill Road, Girl Scouts Road, and Lake Prince Drive for cutting and spraying vegetation on the bridges from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Girl Scout Road, Matoaka Road, and Milners Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile operations on Girl Scout Road, Matoaka Road, and Milners Road for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Kings Highway) – A contractor will have a mobile operation on Kings Highway between Nansemond Parkway and Sleepy Hole Road for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have a mobile operation eastbound and westbound on Nansemond Parkway between Kings Highway and Portsmouth Boulevard for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(Pruden Boulevard) – A contractor will have a mobile operation eastbound and westbound on Pruden Boulevard between North Main Street and the Isle of Wight County line for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(College Drive) – A contractor will have alternating southbound lane closures on College Drive at Lakeview Parkway from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Upcoming Projects:

(Southwestern Boulevard) – Southwestern Boulevard will be closed between OKelly Drive and Trumpet Drive with a detour in place from October 24, 2018 to April 2019 for a bridge replacement. The current bridge will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure.

Ongoing Projects:

(Simons Drive) – A contractor will have Simons Drive closed to thru traffic between Indian Trail and Old Myrtle Road from August 9, 2018 to April 2, 2019 for a bridge replacement. The current bridge will be removed and replaced with a concrete structure.

(Portsmouth Boulevard) – A contractor will have the eastbound and westbound shoulders closed in the 1200 block of Portsmouth Boulevard.

(West Washington Street) – A contractor will have a westbound right lane closure in the 1000 block of West Washington Street between Lipton Tea and the bridge from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily.

(West Constance Road) – A contractor will be installing gas lines on West Constance Road between Holland Road and Main Street. This work will take place between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. and will require intermittent lane or shoulder closures.

(Old Somerton Road, Carolina Road, Whaleyville Boulevard, Rosewood Drive) – A contractor will be installing new water lines on Old Somerton Road, Carolina Road, Whaleyville Boulevard, and Rosewood Drive. The speed limit within the area has been lowered to 35 mph. Beginning Thursday, August 16, the contractor will have a southbound flagging operation in the 1500 block of Whaleyville Boulevard continuing southbound to the 1800 block daily from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The project is expected to continue through December 2018.

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
