

### **“Bicycle Crossing” Sign (W11-1)**

Most drivers of motor vehicles do not anticipate encountering bicycles on a City highway or arterial roadway. However, in circumstances where a substantial number of bicyclists are present in a given area, appropriate signage may be considered for installation.

At his discretion, the City Traffic Engineer may erect “Bicycle Crossing” signage at locations where bicycles frequently cross public roadways upon conducting an engineering study and determining that appropriate warrants are met. Typical locations which might be appropriate for such installations are areas with a history of accidents and/or areas with sight distance restrictions where the crossing cannot be relocated to provide adequate visibility. This sign is not intended to be installed within subdivisions or on dead-end or unpaved roads due to slow speeds and local traffic. Consideration of the engineering study may include but is not limited to traffic volumes, approach speeds, street design and condition, sight distance, accident history, and frequency of crossing.
