SUFFOLK, Va. (July 13, 2009) – As a courtesy and convenience for residents affected by yesterday's severe weather, Suffolk Department of Public Works has stationed three large debris containers on Keaton Way, Foxworth Circle and at the intersection of Kings Fork Road and Robbs Drive. These containers will be in place for a limited time. Residents of any of the affected communities may use these containers for non-hazardous, storm debris, free of charge.

Storm debris can also be placed in regular approved trash containers. Citizens are also encouraged to deliver their debris to the regional landfill where Suffolk residents can dispose of debris free of charge, up to 12 times per vehicle per year.

Residents who want individual pickup of debris should contact Public Works at 514-7630 to schedule under the department's established special collections procedure. The pickup fee for piles up to 8 cubic yards (size of a small car) is \$20 and up to 16 cubic yards is \$50.
