Whispers of legends and lore lurk in the autumn shadows of downtown Suffolk's historic Main Street as *Legends of Main Street: A Suffolk Ghost Walk* gets underway. Suffolk Tourism successfully introduced this 90-minute guided walking tour in the fall of 2010 and has increased the tour dates for 2011 based on an overwhelming response from the public. The Suffolk ghost walk season kicks off, with Ghost Walks departing from the Suffolk Visitor Center located inside the historic Nansemond County Courthouse at 524 North Main Street. Tickets are \$10 for adults and

\$8 for seniors. This evening stroll offers a look into the persistent, sometimes eerie, occurrences of Suffolk's Main Street and beyond and is not recommended for the very young or the faint of heart.

- *National Take-Back Initiative Day*



On October 29, 2011, the Drug Enforcement Administration (Richmond District) will partner with the Virginia State Police, Suffolk Police Department and other local agencies to conduct a statewide prescription drug take-back. The event, National Take-Back Initiative Day, is a collaborative effort to remove potentially dangerous prescription drugs from our nation's homes. A national take-back day will provide an opportunity for the public to surrender expired, unwanted, or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications to law enforcement officers for destruction.

Suffolk Police Department investigators will be on hand at Walmart, 1200 North Main Street, and the Bennett's Creek Pharmacy, 3219 Bridge Road, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for the collection of unwanted and unneeded prescription drugs.

This program provides an opportunity for everyone to clean out their medicine cabinets and dispose of controlled, non-controlled, and over the counter substances. Participants will not be asked any questions and requests for identification will not be made.

Participants may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing the medication from its container. If an original container is submitted, it is asked that you remove any identifying information from the prescription label. All solid dosage pharmaceutical products and liquids in consumer containers may be accepted. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container.

Intravenous solutions, injectibles, and syringes will not be accepted due to potential hazard posed by blood-borne pathogens.

• *Red Ribbon Week*



Mayor Linda T. Johnson presented a Proclamation designating the week of October 23, 2011 through October 29, 2011 as “Red Ribbon Week” in the City of Suffolk. At the October 19th City Council meeting, representatives from the Suffolk Substance Abuse Youth, the Suffolk Youth Advisory Council and the Office on Youth made a public commitment and dedication to educate the citizens in the community about the effects of drug abuse of every kind.

During the week of October 23 – 29, 2011, youth in schools and churches will pledge to live a drug-free life style. As a way of showing support, the Substance Abuse Youth Council, in partnership with the Suffolk Youth Advisory Council, will host a poster contest in the Parks and Recreation afterschool programs. They are also asking the community to wear a red ribbon or the color red on Friday, October 28, 2011 to celebrate National Red Ribbon Week.

Red ribbons will be displayed and distributed throughout various City departments.

The displaying of red ribbons serves as a symbol of intolerance towards the use of drugs. The mission of the Red Ribbon Campaign is to present a unified and visible commitment towards the creation of a DRUG-FREE America.
