“Legends of Main Street: A Suffolk Ghost Walk”.

You don't stand a ghost of a chance of not being intrigued about a walking tour hosted by the Suffolk Division of Tourism. It's called “Legends of Main Street: A Suffolk Ghost Walk”. The tour takes you on a journey into the more “haunting” areas of Downtown Suffolk. You begin the walk at the Old Nansemond County Courthouse (c. 1775), now home to the Suffolk Visitor's Center. This location has a rich Civil War history, and was the site of a bizarre trial in the early 1900's. You'll also visit Riddick's Folly (c. 1837), the Suffolk Seaboard Train Station Museum (c. 1885), Cedar Hill Cemetery (c. 1802) and much more. You might even run into a few “ghosts” along the way. We're sure you will find the tour entertaining, spooky and a little quirky.

“The Legends of Main Street: A Suffolk Ghost Walk” takes place on November 13th beginning at 5:30 p.m. The cost is \$10 for adults and \$8 for seniors and kids. However, because of the nature of the tour, it is not recommended for children under 12 years old. Comfortable shoes are recommended because the walking tour lasts an hour and a half.
