## **UPDATE**

SUFFOLK, VIRGINIA (January 26, 2011) Members of Suffolk's Special Investigations Unit, aided by SWAT, executed two early morning search warrants for narcotics. The operations were conducted simultaneously at approximately 5:30 a.m. One of the locations searched was an apartment located in the 100 block of Nancy Drive. The second location was a single family dwelling located in the 3300 block of Jackson Road.

The two locations were found through a four month investigation to be connected in the distribution of heroin. Approximately two thousand dollars worth of heroin was recovered. Police also recovered approximately \$52,000 worth of currency from a safe at one of the residences, and through bank accounts associated with the suspects. Another \$13,000 worth of property, including flat screen televisions, car rims and accessories, gaming systems, and jewelry were also seized. Three handguns, two assault rifles and one long rifle were also seized.

Police have charged Malcolm Q. Edmond, age 37, of the 3300 block of Jackson Road, and Jelisa A. Lewis, age 21, of the 3300 block of Jackson Road, with possession of heroin with intent to distribute, conspiracy to commit a felony, and possession of a firearm while in possession of heroin. They are both being held in Western Tidewater Regional Jail with no bond.

Warrants are outstanding for William "Messy" Mizelle, age 30, of the 2300 block of Lake Cahoon Road. Once located, he will be charged with possession of heroin with intent to distribute, conspiracy to commit a felony, possession of a firearm while in possession of heroin, and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

Anyone with information on Mizelle's whereabouts is asked to contact Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. If a caller's information leads to an arrest, the caller could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000.
