TFC Recycling Begins Delivery of Big Bins As Curbside Pickup Returns to Suffolk

SUFFOLK, Va (July 2, 2010) - TFC Recycling has begun delivery of 95-gallon rolling bins to hundreds of residents who have signed-up and paid for the first three months of the City's new curbside recycling service. The first bins are arriving at homes across the city over the next two weeks.

Among the first to receive a Big Bin will be **Suffolk City Councilman Charles Parr**, who was also one of the first to subscribe in December when the program was announced. **A TFC truck will deliver the bin to Parr's home in the Suffolk Borough, as well as to other participants in his neighborhood, at 11 am on Tuesday July 6. Councilman Parr as well as other city and TFC officials will be on hand.**

More than 2,500 households have indicated interest in the program. "We are continuing to collect payment from those residents so we can order and deliver their bins," says Ed Farmer, Vice President of TFC Recycling, which will collect the paper, bottles, cans and cardboard that residents recycle. "We will start curbside service the week of July 19th so those homeowners with the bins should put them out with their trash cans starting that week and then every other week thereafter," Farmer says. "Residents who have not yet gone online to complete paperwork and pay the \$36 first quarter fee should do so immediately to ensure they receive their recycling container this month."

Suffolk residents can continue to subscribe to the curbside recycling program by visiting www.tfcrecycling.com/suffolk where they will be prompted to complete the service agreement and order their bin. Suffolk is the first city in the region to introduce Big Bin curbside recycling on a subscription basis.
