### **New Suffolk Visitor Center Grand Opening**

SUFFOLK, VIRGINIA (November 9, 2010) — The City of Suffolk proudly invites you to take part in the rebirth of a historic building which now serves as the information gateway for Virginia's largest city. The Grand Opening of the new Suffolk Visitor Center takes place November 19, 2010 at 4 pm.

The center is housed at the repurposed Nansemond County Courthouse located at 524 North Main Street, one of Suffolk's busiest corridors. It's only fitting that the provincial Roman Revival style structure with its very tall Tuscan columns is now a permanent ambassador for Suffolk, providing an inviting entrance for travelers. The center is within easy walking distance from the Suffolk Conference Center, Riddick's Folly House Museum, restaurants and shoppes.

Join Mayor Linda Johnson, City Manager Selena Cuffee-Glenn, City Council Members and other officials for the ribbon cutting ceremony—followed by a tour of the center. The first floor provides an exhibit gallery highlighting the history of Suffolk and the Great Dismal Swamp. There is also a greeting and information area, a gift shop, a refreshment area and WIFI access. Visitors and residents alike can gather details about Suffolk's attractions and events, dining, accommodation and shopping opportunities and purchase tickets to community

events. The Department of Economic Development and Division of Tourism occupy offices on the second floor. The Suffolk Visitor Center is open daily from 9 am until 5 pm.

### **About the former Nansemond County Courthouse**

As a courthouse, the building played a pivotal role in the history of old Nansemond County and the City of Suffolk. The 1840 era building is the third such structure built on the site. Two previous courthouses were destroyed by fires during the Revolutionary War and “The Great Fire” on June 3, 1837. During the Civil War, the courthouse was reportedly used as barracks for Union Soldiers. The building remained in use as a courthouse until 1998 when the Mills Godwin Courts Complex was opened.
