Since 1982, Crime Line and Crime Solvers in Hampton Roads have helped to close the book on more than 20,000 cases and have assisted in the recovery of millions of dollars in stolen property and illegal drugs.

Callers are able to provide information and do not have to fear reprisal. They never have to give their name, their telephone number is not traced, and they never have to appear in court.
