## **UPDATE**

SUFFOLK, Va. (April 1, 2009) Suffolk Police have placed charges in connection with several of the burglaries that occurred in the southern end of the city between January and March. Frank Arthur Pearson V, age 22, of the 800 blk. of Milford Lane has been charged with one count of burglary, four counts of grand larceny and three counts of larceny of items with intent to sell. Nicholas Ryan Chaney, age 20, of the 2600 of Whaleyville Blvd. has been charged with one count of grand larceny and one count of larceny of items with intent to sell.

Pearson is being held at Western Tidewater Regional Jail with no bond. Chaney was arrested yesterday. He was released on \$3,500 bond. He is scheduled for arraignment in General District Court on April 9, 2009.

Police continue to investigate these crimes and are still working to connect recovered property to owners. Police are also asking that anyone that may have purchased or been given items by either of these subjects to contact police or Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up.

## **UPDATE**

SUFFOLK, Va. (March 17 2009) As a result of the investigation into the southern end burglaries, Suffolk Police executed search warrants at two locations yesterday, residences in the 800 blk. of Milford Ln. and 100 blk. Forest Glen Dr.

At those locations, they recovered construction tools, generators, lawn equipment and power tools that are believed to have been stolen.

Because property owners could not provide serial numbers in a large number of the burglaries, police are making these items available for viewing to those burglary victims this evening. Property owners can respond to Police Headquarters this evening from 5-8 p.m. to view the recovered items.

The investigation is ongoing. No charges have been filed in the burglaries. However, a resident of one of the locations searched, Frank Pearson V, age 22, of the 800 blk. of Milford Ln., was charged with possession of heroin and possession of marijuana in ref. to narcotics were recovered during the search. Pearson has also been identified as one of the subjects in the video that was released earlier in the week.

## **POLICE SEEK LEADS IN SOUTHERN END BURGLARIES**

SUFFOLK, Va. (March 15 2009) Suffolk Police are investigating numerous burglaries that have occurred, in the southern end area of the city, over the past

three months. The burglaries have been committed primarily during daytime hours and thieves are targeting jewelry, cash, coins, electronics, tools, and power equipment such as generators and air compressors.

There have been thirty such instances since January 3<sup>rd</sup> of this year. The burglaries have occurred in locations such as Freeman Mill Road, Holland Road, Indian Trail Road, Longstreet Lane and several other rural areas throughout the Rt. 58, Rt. 13/32 corridor. Seven of the burglaries, were burglaries to sheds.

Police are asking citizens to be aware and be on the look out for unusual vehicles, possible unlicensed door to door sales people, or vehicles stopped in unusual places, any suspicious activity or persons in the area. Citizens should look out for their neighbors during the daytime and report anything they feel out of the ordinary to police. Citizens observing anything suspicious or knowing anything about these crimes should call the police or 1-888-LOCK-U-UP. If the information you provide leads to an arrest, you may be eligible to up to a \$1000.00 reward.
