Police Seek to Identify Suspects in Credit Card Fraud

SUFFOLK, Va. (May 11, 2009) – Suffolk Police are attempting to identify two suspects in a credit card fraud, who could be responsible for thousands of dollars of fraud across Hampton Roads. Police advise that on April 5, two female suspects entered the Walgreen Drug Store located in the 3600 block of Bridge Road in Suffolk. The two made seven transactions in which they purchased gift cards with fraudulent credit cards. Combined purchases totaled in excess of \$3000.

Police believe these same two suspects possibly committed similar crimes at a Walgreen Drug Store and a Rite Aid Pharmacy in Newport News and Nordstrom in Norfolk. The total amount of fraudulent transactions is in excess of \$30,000.

The two suspects are described as black, females, early twenties, both with long hair. Detective John Jones is the lead investigator on this case.

Anyone that might be able to identify these suspects is asked to contact Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line you do not have to give your name or appear in court. If your information leads to an arrest, you could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000.
