UPDATE

SUFFOLK, Va. (July 1, 2009) Media coverage and calls to Crime Line helped to lead police to the suspect in this residential burglary. A seventeen year old Suffolk male has been identified and interviewed in connection with this case. Based on information obtained, detectives will be securing petitions for burglary for the juvenile.

Because of the subject's age, his name and photo can not be released.

SUFFOLK POLICE SEEK TO IDENTIFY PHOTOGENIC BURGLARY SUSPECT

SUFFOLK, Va. (June 28, 2009) Suffolk Police are hoping a photo taken with a camera phone will help them solve a burglary. But the photo wasn't taken by an alert witness, but by the suspect himself, while he was committing the crime.

Suffolk Police advise that during the first week of June, investigators were called to the scene of a residential burglary in the 200 blk. of Holbrook Arch. Detectives learned that during the burglary, the suspect attempted to use the home owner's cell phone but was unsuccessful. The suspect was successful however, in using the camera feature of the phone. The suspect took a photograph of himself and left the cell phone behind.

Police are asking for assistance in identifying the subject in the photo left at the scene. Anyone that may be able assist police are asked to contact Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-

Up. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. If the caller's information leads to an arrest, the caller could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000.

Detective Joseph Antinarelli is the lead investigator in this case.
