Suffolk, VA (July 22, 2009) Angel has been located and is being returned to her owners. Police were contacted this afternoon by an individual who advised that Angel was given to her given to her teenage daughter yesterday by a co-worker, after Angel was observed walking on Constance Rd.. The caller advised that she had observed the photo and story of Angel online and immediately contacted police.

Angel was taken to the Suffolk Animal Shelter and her owners were notified. They are currently in route to pick her up.

POLICE ARE HOPING FOR ANGEL'S RETURN

Suffolk, VA (July 22, 2009) Suffolk Police are investigating a larceny and hoping for the return of an Angel...Angel, the Pomeranian, that is. Police advise that on Tuesday just before 10 a.m., Angel, an eight pound, cream colored, Pomeranian slipped out of the door of her residence in the 200 block of Katherine Street.

Angel trotted down the street, while her owner called for her to come back. When Angel reached the corner, her owner advised, a white female in a small vehicle, opened her car door, called Angel over, scooped the pup up and fled the scene.

Now Angel's family, including her five year old "sister" is heartbroken. The family has spent numerous hours searching, posting flyers and placing newspaper ads. The incident was reported to Suffolk Police.

Police don't have a lot to go on in this case and are hoping the public can assist. The only suspect description available is a white, middle aged, female in a light, colored, small vehicle, possible an SUV type such as a Toyota RAV4.

Angel's owners advise that she is tiny, with solid cream colored fur that is almost white. Angel is sporting a short, summer cut. She is not wearing a collar.
