## **SUFFOLK WOMAN CHARGED WITH MULTIPLE BOMB THREATS**

SUFFOLK, VA (October 21, 2009) A forty-eight year old Suffolk woman has been charged with a recent string of bomb threats to a local high school and a Walgreens located on Bridge Rd. Today, Suffolk Fire Marshals in conjunction with the Chesapeake Fire Marshals' Office arrested Remonia Yvonne Hines, of the 4000 Block of Pughsville Road.

Hines was charged with five counts of threatening to bomb. Two of the charges are for incidents in the City of Suffolk. The remaining three charges were issued in the City of Chesapeake for bomb threats to a Chesapeake business.

Nansemond River High School experienced a series of bomb threats with the first occurring on September 25<sup>th</sup>. The school has since been the target of four additional bomb threats.

Each bomb threat charge is a felony, punishable by up to 10 years in prison for each threat made. In addition, if convicted Hines could be required to pay restitution to cover the cost of all responding emergency personnel and equipment.

Hines is currently being held at Western Tidewater Regional Jail without bond. Additional charges for Suffolk incidents are pending.
