UPDATE

SUFFOLK, Virginia (December 8, 2010) Investigators have obtained additional surveillance video of the suspects in the Sunoco robbery. In the additional footage, the two suspects are seen fleeing the business (video 1), running to the getaway car (video 2), and driving around Sentara Obici Hospital (video 3). The vehicle the suspects used for a getaway appears to be a dark colored Chrysler product, possibly late 90's Avenger/Sebring type.

Police are asking that anyone that may have information on this incident contact Crime Line at 1-800-LOCK-U-UP. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. If a caller's information leads to an arrest, the caller could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000.

POLICE INVESTIGATE SUNOCO ROBBERY

SUFFOLK, Virginia (December 8, 2010) Suffolk Police are investigating the robbery of a local convenience store Friday night. Investigators advise that just before 10 p.m., two males entered the Sunoco located in the 2700 block of Godwin Boulevard. Two clerks were on duty in the business when one of the subjects brandished a firearm and demanded a clerk open the registers and give them the money. The suspect forced the victim to lay on the floor.

One of the suspects is described as a black male, wearing a black hoodie, dark jeans, black tennis shoes, and a bandana covering his face. The second suspect's race is unknown. He was wearing a black shirt or jacket and blue jeans.

Both suspects fled the business on foot. No one was injured during the incident.

Police are asking that anyone that may have information on this incident contact Crime Line at 1-800-LOCK-U-UP. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. If a caller's information leads to an arrest, the caller could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000. Investigator N. Boone is the lead investigator on this case.
