SUFFOLK, VA (November 10, 2010) - Suffolk Police have charged three people and are looking for a fourth in connection with burglaries at Dashiell's Showroom, located in the 1400 blk. of Holland Rd., on October 6th and October 12th. Three Suffolk residents, Chase Brooks - age 20, Brian Campbell - age 21, and Mary Bannister - age 18, were arrested November 4th. Their arrest came after weeks of investigative work and many tips to Crime Line.

Brooks was charged with two counts of burglary, one count of conspiracy to commit burglary, two counts of grand larceny of firearm, two counts of grand larceny with intent to sell and two counts of possession of burglarious tools. Campbell was charged with one count of possession of firearm by a convicted felon, one count of conspiracy to commit grand larceny with intent to sell and one count of receiving stolen firearms. Bannister was charged with one count of conspiracy to commit grand larceny with intent to sell and one count of receiving stolen firearms. Brooks and Campbell are in Western Tidewater Regional Jail with no bond. Bannister was released on \$6,000 bond.

Police are looking for Kendall Pittman, age 19. Pittman is wanted for one count burglary, one count conspiracy to commit burglary, one count grand larceny of firearm, one count grand larceny with intent to sell and one count possession of burglarious tools. Pittman also has outstanding warrants for two counts of forgery, one count of petit larceny and one count of manufacturing or distributing marijuana in unrelated cases.

Three of the stolen weapons were recovered at a residence in Virginia Beach after the execution of the search warrant. Police are still attempting to locate the remaining firearms.

Anyone with information on Pittman's whereabouts are asked to contact Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. If a caller's information leads to an arrest the caller could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000.
