Police Seek Assistance in Larceny Investigation

SUFFOLK, VA (May 19, 2010) Suffolk Police are attempting to identify three subjects that may be connected with a grand larceny and are asking for assistance from the public. Police advise that on April 25, 2010, a customer at a convenience store in the 400 blk. of Carolina Rd placed her cell phone on the counter while she made a purchase. During the course of the transaction, her Samsung Omnia cell phone – valued at almost \$300 – was stolen.

Police are attempting to identify three subjects that were at the store at the time of the larceny. Police would like to speak with the customer that was behind the victim in line. He is described as a black male, in his 20's, 6'-6'3", wearing a red hat and white shirt. He appeared to be with two other subjects at the business. The three subjects possibly left in a late 90's model Infinity J-series, white in color. Surveillance video and still photos from the time of the larceny are attached.

Police are releasing photos and video of the transaction in hopes that someone may be able to identify the subjects. Anyone with information on this incident is asked to contact Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. If the caller's information leads to an arrest, the caller could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000. Officer J. Lurie is the primary investigator in this case.
