Police Seek to Identify Suspect in Credit Card Fraud

SUFFOLK, VA (March 25, 2011) Suffolk Police are investigating a credit card fraud and are requesting assistance from the public in identifying the suspect. Police advise that the victim of the fraud resides in Alaska. On February 27 at approximately 3:07 a.m., her charge card number was used at WalMart located in the 6200 block of College Drive in Suffolk.

The subject that used the card bought an iPad using a card with the victim's account number. The same subject purchased a second iPad using a different card. It is unknown with certainty if that card contained a fraudulent account number.

The suspect in this case was captured on surveillance video. In the images he is wearing a vest and hat.

Anyone that may be able to identify the suspect is asked to call Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. If a caller's information leads to an arrest, the caller could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000.

Detective Q. Beers is the lead investigator assigned to the case.
