UPDATE

SUFFOLK, Va. (June 7, 2010) Suffolk Police arrested and charged two Portsmouth men in connection with an incident in which a teen was grazed by a bullet after getting off of a school bus last week. Investigators arrested Devin Rashard Wells, age 19, of the 3800 blk. of Magnolia Dr., Thursday and Maurice Daquan Moore, age 18, of the 5600 blk. of Darby Close, Friday. They were each charged with one count malicious wounding, one count use of a firearm in the commission of a felony and one count of conspiracy to commit a felony.

Police advise that Wells and Moore had an altercation with a subject that had gotten off of the bus. Several shots were fired. A sixteen year old male sustained an abrasion to the leg, which was possibly caused by a bullet ricocheting off of the pavement.

Both men are currently being held at Western Tidewater Regional Jail with no bond.

Detective Herbert Bruce is the lead investigator.

TEENS GRAZED BY BULLET

SUFFOLK, VA (June 3, 2010) A sixteen year old male that had exited a school bus on Smith St in the area of Wellons St. was grazed by a bullet and sustained an abrasion to

the leg. Police were notified just before 3 p.m. of shots fired in the area after King Fork High students exited a school bus. Witnesses reported approx. four shots were fired.

Upon arrival, police learned that a sixteen year old male had been wounded. The victim's injury was reported to be minor. He did not require transport to a hospital. Police do not believe that the student was the target of the shooting. The school bus had pulled off prior to the shooting.

There is no suspect information available at this time. Police are continuing to investigate. Detective H. Bruce is the lead investigator.
