*The purpose of the Youth Public Safety Academy is to introduce at risk youth to public safety professions. The academy will also provide an educational experience that includes hands-on activities based on actual public safety functions and duties. The friendly atmosphere offers positive interaction with public safety that develops an appreciation for their duties and responsibilities.*

### Prerequisites

1. Must be a student between the ages of 13 and 17 years of age, enrolled and participating in public, private or home school.
2. Student must make an effort to maintain passing grades in all classes.
3. Students must abide by an established dress code, as they will be operating in a professional environment and should be dressed accordingly. Attire may change based on the specific class activity.
4. Students will be required to conduct themselves in a mature and business like manner. Acts of disrespect or horseplay that disrupt the academy will not be tolerated.
