### **ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS**

SUFFOLK, VA (August 31, 2012) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Friday, August 31, 2012, due to construction and maintenance projects:

**New Projects:**

(Chapel Drive) – There is high water on Chapel Drive from the recent rain and flooding.

(Murphys Mill Road) – A contractor will have a flagging operation in the 200 block of Murphys Mill Road from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(Indian Trail and Old Myrtle Road) – City of Suffolk Public Works will have mobile road closures with detours in place in two hour increments to replace asphalt over new cross pipes. The work will begin at Indian Trail between Asburn Road and Simons Drive, then move to Old Myrtle Road between Old Mill Road and White Drive, and finish on Old Myrtle Road between Buckhorn Drive and Joyners Bridge Road.

(Town Point Road and Pughsville Road) – City of Suffolk Public Works Traffic Engineering Paint Crew will have mobile lane closures on Town Point Road and Pughsville Road from 8:30 a.m. to 12 p.m.

(Brookwood Drive) – Brookwood Drive will be closed to thru traffic between Magnolia Drive and Camellia Drive, Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. All thru traffic will be detoured to surrounding streets. City, Emergency, and Resident access will be accommodated as needed.

**Ongoing Projects:**

(Route 10) - Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagger operation on Route 10 between Everets Road and Kings Highway until 3 p.m. This work zone is an ongoing project set for completion by December of 2012.

(Shoulders Hill Road and Nansemond Parkway intersection) - A contractor will continue with ongoing work at the intersection of Shoulder's Hill Road and Nansemond Parkway.

(Mills Godwin Bridge, Route 17/Bridge Road) - A contractor will be removing and replacing the concrete bridge deck overlay material at the Mills Godwin Bridge, Route 17/Bridge Road. The work zone will be in effect from 7 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday. The work project is expected to last 90 days, weather permitting, with flagging operations in place during work hours.

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
