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ROAD CLOSURES AND POSSIBLE TRAFFIC DELAYS

SUFFOLK, VA (October 17, 2016) The following roads in the City of Suffolk will have closures that could cause delays, Monday, October 17, 2016, due to construction and maintenance projects.

New Projects:

(Charlotte Avenue) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have Charlotte Avenue closed at Laurel Street and Lewis Avenue from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Godwin Boulevard) – A contractor will have a shoulder closure on the Godwin Boulevard on-ramp from westbound Route 58 and a westbound lane closure on the overpass on Godwin Boulevard from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

(Wilroy Road) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures on Wilroy Road between Progress Road and Turner Road for a milling and paving operation overnight from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. This work will include the Route 58 eastbound and westbound on ramps and the Route 58 westbound exit ramp.

(Main Street) – A contractor will have a lane closure on Main Street between VDOT and Murphys Mill Road from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. The contractor will have the outside lane southbound and the outside lane northbound between the above mentioned areas of Main Street closed for roadway improvements, October 17th through October 21st.

(Route 58) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have mobile lane closures westbound on Route 58 between Portsmouth Boulevard and the Chesapeake City line for vegetation maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(College Drive and Bridge Road) – A contractor will have mobile operations on College Drive and Bridge Road for vegetation maintenance from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

(White Marsh Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a lane shift in the 1200 block of White Marsh Road to repair a washout from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The lane shift will remain in place for 24 hours until the work is complete.

(Kingsale Road and Indian Trail Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have flagging operations on Kingsale Road and Indian Trail Road for ditch maintenance from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Portsmouth Boulevard) – A contractor will have mobile lane closures overnight from 7:30 p.m. to 3 a.m. for overhead sign inspections on Portsmouth Boulevard at the intersections starting at Suburban Drive moving east.

(Hosier Road) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation in the 8000 block of Hosier Road for shoulder maintenance from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.

(Harvest Drive) – Suffolk Department of Public Works will have a flagging operation in the 7900 block of Harvest Drive at the bridge from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

(Godwin Boulevard) – Suffolk Department of Public Works Traffic Engineering Paint Crew will have mobile lane closures on Godwin Boulevard between Everets Road and Sack Point Road from 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

(Old Mill Road) – Old Mill Road will remain closed between Old Myrtle Road and Indian Trail Road until further notice due to a washout at the bridge in the 3700 to 3900 block.

(Lake Cohoon Road) – Lake Cohoon Road at North Joyner Court will remain closed until further notice due to a washout.

(Murphys Mill Road) – The eastbound lane in the 900 block of Murphys Mill Road will remain closed until further notice due to a washout. The westbound lane is open.

(Nansemond Parkway) – A contractor will have alternating lane closures in the 1200 block of Nansemond Parkway for utility work from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., October 13th through October 19th.

Ongoing Projects:

(Arthur Drive) – A contractor will be reconstructing bridges over Spivey Run and Langston Swamp on Arthur Drive. A detour will be in place to direct motorists with the detour in place. This closure is expected to be complete by December 30, 2016.

(Highland Avenue) – A contractor will be installing a new pump station and sewer and water lines on Highland Avenue between Kingsboro Street and the end of Highland Avenue at the cul-de-sac. This project will continue through June 2017.

(Seaboard Trail) – A contractor will have the Seaboard Trail from Main Street to Moore Avenue closed to all pedestrians until further notice. The contractor is estimating a December completion date.

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
