POLICE SEEK PUBLIC'S ASSISTANCE IN LOCATING CREDIT CARD FRAUD SUSPECTS

SUFFOLK, VA (October 3, 2017) – The Suffolk Police Department is seeking the public's assistance in identifying several suspects involved in a number of credit card fraud cases.

The attached surveillance images show the four subjects involved in a credit card fraud at the Wawa in the 2900 block of Godwin Boulevard that occurred on July 7, 2017.

In addition, the subject wearing the white shirt and red hat in the Wawa surveillance footage is also a suspect in a credit card fraud that occurred at the Walmart in the 6200 block of College Drive on August 21, 2017.

Also attached are photos of the vehicles involved in the incidents.

Anyone with information is asked to please contact Suffolk Crime Line at 1-888-Lock-U-Up. When calling Crime Line, callers do not have to give their names or appear in court. Citizens can also utilize TipSoft to anonymously submit crime-related tips through the Web, a text message, or from any Android or iPhone mobile device with the TipSubmit mobile app. Tips can be submitted by visiting www.tipsubmit.com, or by

texting the word “**CRIMES**” (274637) with the keyword **SPDVATIP**. TipSoft also supports users’ ability to submit videos or photos using the TipSoft mobile app. If information leads to an arrest, the caller or “tipster” could qualify for a reward of up to \$1,000.
