

**DEFACING MONUMENTS
AND/OR TREES/PLANTS**

Any person who shall injure, deface or remove any part of any cemetery enclosure monument, tombstone, slab, urn or other appurtenance shall be guilty of a class 6 felony. Anyone who shall destroy or injure any tree, shrub, vine, plant or flower shall be guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor.

Anyone who shall hunt with a gun, dog, or otherwise in any cemetery, or shall shoot any gun, pistol or other firearms in any cemetery, for each offense shall be fined not more than \$500.00; however, this provision shall not apply to the firing of the military salute over the grave of any soldier, sailor or marine, nor to the firing of the salute on Memorial Day.

**PERSONS FORBIDDEN IN
CEMETERIES AT NIGHT**

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive, ride, walk or otherwise be in any cemetery during the period from one hour after sunset to sunrise, without a written permit previously obtained from the superintendent of cemeteries. A fine of no more than \$100.00 shall be paid if anyone is found to be violating this provision.

No interments, disinterment, or removals shall be permitted after 3:30 p.m. of any day except in the case of an emergency or on Christmas Day.

No monument shall be more than eight feet wide, no more than two feet thick, nor shall it project above the grade of the lot more than 4-1/2 feet.

Foundations for monuments must be of solid masonry or concrete. Foundations for monuments must be laid not less than four feet below the grade of the lot.



The area of the top of all such foundations must extend at least four inches beyond the base of the superstructure and level or flush with the ground at the point of installation.

MONUMENTS

Not more than one monument may be erected in any lot; and any stone that projects above the grade of the lot shall be deemed to



DECORATIONS

Plantings, ornaments, decorations or flags may be placed on any grave or lot in any city cemetery, subject to the right of the superintendent to remove them after the expiration of five days.

As soon as flowers, wreaths, emblems, etc. used at funerals, or placed on graves at other times, become unsightly and faded, they will be removed and no responsibility for their protection or maintenance is assumed.

No person other than cemetery employees, the lot owner or members of the family will be permitted to remove wreaths, emblems, etc. from a lot or grave unless written permission from the owner or his legal representative is presented to the superintendent of cemeteries.
